HANSEN, Wayne, age 100, died peacefully of natural causes on January 1st, 2013, in San Leandro. Born May 8th, 1912, in Chico, California, he was the only child of almond-farming parents, Charles and Anna May (Schilling) Hansen in Dayton, California. His boyhood was spent there in Butte County working on the farm in Dayton and at his grandfather's (John Schilling's) blacksmith shop in Nelson. He attended the one-room schoolhouse in Dayton through grade six, then middle school and high school in Durham. He graduated from Chico State Teacher's College with a BS in biology, took pre-med classes at UC Berkeley, and then completed medical school at the University of California at San Francisco in 1939. He joined the U.S. Navy Medical Corps in 1940, serving as a general surgeon and (later) urologist aboard destroyers and hospital ships in the Pacific throughout WWII. There, he also met his wife, Catherine (Kitty) Shaw, a U.S. Navy Nurse. They married in 1946. Wayne stayed in the Navy a total of 32 years, he and Kitty having 4 children and enjoying duty assignments on both U.S. coasts and in Japan and Guam. Retiring at Pearl Harbor as a captain in 1973, he worked 8 more years for the Hawaii State medical system as a consultant. He was a much-loved physician, an excellent father, and an avid gardener, craftsman, woodworker, photographer and philanthropist. He was a long-time member of the choir at Saint Andrews Episcopal Cathedral in Honolulu. He traveled at various times in his retirement to revisit the Pacific, Asia and Europe, maintaining interest in world problems such as poverty, climate change and cultural intolerance. His wit, intellect, humor and quiet-loving patience will be missed by his children and many others. Wayne's wife, Kitty, preceded him in death in 1995.
