The food collected was used to help establish and sustain a food pantry in the Mulford Gardens neighborhood of San Leandro. This food pantry continues to operate with the help of volunteers and Girls Scouts from the Dos Pueblos Service Unit.

To address the poverty issue Rachel collected clothing and shoes to be donated to April Showers, a local non-profit group that showers and clothes the homeless. Rachel achieved her goal by leading over 40 volunteers including Girl Scouts, adults, family and students from San Leandro High School's Interact group.

Rachel has been a member of Troop 30092 in San Leandro for the last 5 years of her 12 years in Girl Scouts. She has served as a Girl Scout Program Aid since 2006, assisting in many Girl Scout activities. Rachel is known to Girl Scouts throughout the Dos Pueblos Service Unit as "Chocolate Chip."
